Greenwood's mission is to rehabilitate orphaned, injured, and sick wildlife for release into appropriate habitats. We are the largest wildlife rehabilitation center treating mammals, birds, and waterfowl on Colorado's Front Range. We care for thousands of animals annually and over 200 different species have come through our doors since we were founded in 1982.

Greenwood also provides outreach programs for people of all ages regarding rehabilitation, humane solutions to human-wildlife conflicts, and how you can help Colorado's wildlife.



OPPORTUNITIES

Animal Care Volunteers Work hands-on with the wildlife admitted to Greenwood! Animal Care Volunteers are responsible for feeding, cleaning and general care of the animals. Specific duties include food preparation, hand feeding baby wildlife, cleaning cages, maintaining a clean environment, refreshing food and water, and other tasks as specified by staff.

Front Desk Volunteers Answer phone calls from individuals dealing with wildlife in distress and complete intake paperwork on new admissions of injured and orphaned animals. This position is vital to accomplishing the work we do at Greenwood.

M.I.C.E Team Volunteers (Most Important Care & Enrichment) Support the animal care staff by helping with food preparation, laundry, making sure our facilities are in tip- top shape, or landscaping.

Education & Outreach Volunteers

Visit schools and community groups to educate the public about wildlife and Greenwood's work. Use animal artifacts, presentations, and games to get kids excited about our local wild animals.

Thrift Store & Consignment Gallery
Attendant Volunteers Maintain an
organized sales floor and assist patrons
with merchandise at our retail stores in
Boulder. All proceeds from the

Fundraising Volunteers Lend a hand with fundraising events, like our annual gala, "Wild Night for Wildlife." There are plenty of ways to help such as taking photos, manning game stations, soliciting businesses for donations, and more.

Volunteer Groups Greenwood accepts groups of volunteers (age 18 and older) to do maintenance, gardening, and cleaning projects around the facility. Volunteers don't have direct contact with the animals. Groups should be between 5 -10 people. This is a great way for your workplace to give back!
