## How You Can Help

We need citizen scientists to gather data on bird collisions in downtown Denver during the spring and fall migrations. Volunteers will patrol a route in to inspect the area for deceased and injured birds, collecting data, and coordinating with other volunteers and the Lights Out coordinator. Your effort is vital for our project's success. EVERY bird matters. Injured birds will be taken to Greenwood Wildlife Rehab Center and deceased birds to the Denver Museum of Nature and Science
