Goose Injured by Arrow Gets Released



Wildlife Stories



The number of baby squirrels at our center is steadily increasing. Recently two from one litter came to us from Longmont. Spring storms caused a tree to fall, knocking the babies from their nest. They were found in the snow, barely moving. The rescuers rushed to warm them and quickly brought them to our center when mom did not come back for them.

When the babies arrived, we could tell that they weren't in the best of shape. Their shivering bodies were thin and lethargic. Rehabbers put the two on heat and promptly administered fluids.

From that point on, the babies have been steadily improving. They are great eaters and curious explorers. Now that they are healthy, Greenwood staff will raise them like the dozens of other baby squirrels that will arrive at our center this spring. The two will be released



A caring resident of Estes Park was watching over a Canada Goose that had not moved much in several days. She returned to the area a few times and noticed the bird could not bear weight on one leg. After several days, she was able to get close enough to capture it and bring it to Greenwood.

When the waterfowl arrived, staff immediately noticed swelling around its foot and ankle. They arranged for X-rays and found no fractures. They assumed that the goose most likely had an infection and treated it with pain medication and antibiotics.

So far the goose is doing well in its recovery which will be ongoing for the next 7 - 10 days. At that point, staff will re-evaluate the waterfowl's condition. We hope to release it back in Estes Park, once it has fully healed.
