# Wildlife Stories



A traveling veterinarian happened to be at a house caring for pets when this Red-breasted Nuthatch hit a window. The vet heard a thump outside but didn't think much of it until she saw the family dog licking something in the grass. When she investigated, she found a bird stunned on the ground. She put it in a box, hoping it would recover before the forecasted storm rolled in. When the bird was still unable to fly some time later, she brought it to our center for treatment. She had taken animals to Greenwood before and was confident our staff would know what to do.

When the bird came to us, its feathers were dried from dog spit and one eye was swollen and squinty, probably from saliva. Our rehabilitators discovered it had head trauma and started it on pain medication and cage rest. It recovered quickly and several days later, this lucky nuthatch was released and took to the skies.



A Cackling Goose was found stuck in the mud near the Wyoming border. This poor bird was in rough shape! It was severely emaciated and covered in mats of mud. The rescuer tried to get it to fly but the waterfowl didn't move. They knew it needed to come to Greenwood. When admitted, our staff weren't sure if it would make it. It was small for a goose, even for the cackling species which are slighter than Canada Geese. The bird weighed in at only two pounds! Tests revealed it had a very high number of parasites in its blood, so we started it on antibiotics. A very nutritious, high protein diet made a big difference. The goose quickly gained weight and was moved to an outdoor enclosure. After 14 days at Greenwood, this feisty bird was released back into wild!
