## Bobcat Kitten Grows Up

Last May we received a call about a bobcat kitten found crying and alone in a backyard. With no sign of the mother, the concerned rescuer called Greenwood for advice. After attempts to reunite the baby with its mom were unsuccessful, the rescuer quickly brought the adorable kitten to Greenwood. Our rehabilitation staff discovered a healthy orphan that just needed a place to call home until he was big enough to be released back into the appropriate habitat. Luckily, our amazing Southern Colorado rehabilitation partner, Sarah Heckathorn, has a facility with a brand new enclosure made specifically for teaching young bobcats to live on their own. This kitten joined several other orphans and together they have grown to be rambunctious cats, nearly ready to face the wild.

**A Patient at the Center**



On November 27th, Greenwood admitted a Canada Goose with a wing injury. It was found unable to fly at the Lake Arbor Golf Course in Arvada. After arriving at the center, we evaluated the goose for visible injuries and X-rayed its wing to look for broken bones. We found a deep tissue wound on the top of the bird's wing but thankfully the X-ray revealed no fractures. Currently, the goose is being treated with antibiotics and pain medication while we wait for the wound to heal. Each day, the goose gets to swim in its own personal pool for a few hours, slowly paddling to-and-fro, and occasionally nibbling on a snack. We hope with regular treatments and a little time, this bird will be able to fly once again and be returned to the wild.
