A woman noticed a “duckling” wandering around her 4-acre farm with no mom to be found. She gathered it up because she was worried that the barn cats might get to it. Then she heard her ducks and geese making a lot of noise in their pens and found three more little ones there. Before she could get them into a box, she saw a couple more about to run under the fence into a big subdivision to the south of her property. She tucked her shirt into her pants and put the ones she had already caught inside her shirt, so they wouldn't get captured by the cats while she chased down the rest.

Believe it or not, it wasn't over yet! Once she had all six contained, she heard her husband calling from the pasture that he had found some more. They scooped those up and spent a few hours observing from a



A family of five was heading out for a bike ride when the five-year-old son noticed something on the sidewalk that he thought was a pine cone. When he got closer to investigate, it turned out it was a baby bird. As they were trying to contain the animal, the three-year-old daughter found another little one that seemed similar in size nearby.

The family lives at the end of a cul-de-sac, and there are lots of birds in the area. They looked around but couldn't find any nests, so they engaged the help of all of the neighbors to do a more thorough search. In spite of the hunt becoming a community effort, they were unsuccessful and didn't observe any birds that appeared as though they might be parents. The

distance to see if mom was still around, but she was nowhere to be found. The woman called her local animal control, and they referred her to Greenwood. They turned out to be baby Common Mergansers! The eight of them are doing well in our care. They love diving in their pools and feasting on lots of live fish. They will be released as soon as they have grown enough to thrive in the wild on their own.

baby birds were very tiny, and their eyes weren't open yet. The family had heard of Greenwood before, so they decided to give us a call. When the two orphans arrived here, they were identified as nestling American Robins. They are doing well in our care and will be released into the wild together. The mother of the children who found the birds told us she was very proud to see her kids go to such tremendous efforts to help the babies.
