Greenwood's mission is to rehabilitate sick, injured, and orphaned wildlife for release into appropriate habitats. Greenwood also strives to educate the public, emphasizing humane solutions to human/wildlife interactions.

History of Greenwood

In 1982, the Humane Society of Boulder Valley (HSBV) founded a wildlife rehabilitation center at their facility. One year later, the family and friends of Natalie Gneiser — a young woman who was killed while trying to rescue an injured dog on the highway — donated memorial funds to this cause, allowing the center to expand to help more patients.

During the next 14 years, the number of animals brought to the center for care increased 20 - 30% each year. Meanwhile, the City of Boulder grew around HSBV, and it became increasingly difficult to provide a quiet and secure environment for recuperating animals.

In March 1993, the Center incorporated due to its continuous growth and was named Greenwood Wildlife Rehabilitation Sanctuary (officially renamed "Center" in 2008). "Greenwood" was the name of the Center's first rehabilitated raccoon, which had been burned in a chimney fire. At the time, Greenwood was operating out of a veterinarian's office in north Longmont.

In 1997, Greenwood secured a lease from Boulder County for property on Highway 66 between Longmont and Lyons. For the next 10 years, it operated out of two modular units on this site. Caging was built for raccoons, songbirds, squirrels, rabbits, coyotes, and foxes.

In 2007, the Center received a contribution to purchase the previously leased property plus an additional 1.5 acres. Another large contribution provided funds to help build a new, state-of-the-art facility, with donations coming from many other supporters. Greenwood moved into this building in early 2009.

Fundraising efforts and the annual budget continued to increase with the addition of a Thrift Shop in 2004 and an annual major event, *Wild Night for Wildlife*, in 2009. In 2012, Greenwood relocated the Thrift Shop and expanded its retail efforts to include a Consignment Gallery, the only nonprofit store of its kind in Boulder County. Education and Outreach programs, the other important component of Greenwood's mission, have consistently grown as well.

It doesn't stop there! We continued to expand our facility by building a waterfowl enclosure in 2017. We added a new crow aviary and finished renovations to our existing fox enclosure in 2019. These improvements allow us to care for more orphans and treat them for longer periods of time, instead of transferring them at an early age to other rehabilitators.

Since its inception, over 200 species have been rehabilitated at Greenwood. With only a small year-round staff, the majority of personnel needed to operate the Center are the more than 500 volunteers, interns, and seasonal employees who work diligently from March through October caring for up to 500 animals a day. Greenwood currently has 18 rehabilitators licensed by Colorado Parks and Wildlife, and our success rate remains high as we all work together. As the only Center providing care for a wide variety of species from north of Pueblo to the Wyoming border, Greenwood provides leadership to the wildlife rehabilitation community throughout Colorado and the nation.

From the Board President

Dear Supporters,

Our mission statement is simple. The challenge lies in the ability to execute it. "We are devoted to the rehabilitation and release of orphaned, injured, and sick wildlife." It seems easy, right? Greenwood had another exceptional year; and, while I say that, I think to myself, "What does that look like and how can we continue to be the stellar organization that we are today?"

Our track record remained strong in 2019. As the only large rehabilitation center along the Front Range from north of Pueblo to the Wyoming border, we continue to feel the pressure of providing care for our state's wildlife. This year we treated over 3,100 animals. Interestingly, buried in this number, is a stark decrease in the number of birds we treated. Many suggest that the freezing cold and snow in late April and early May killed eggs and hatchlings. We would be surprised if these numbers stayed low in 2020.

Our mission features a second component: "We also provide outreach programs for audiences of all ages regarding rehabilitation, humane solutions to human-wildlife conflicts, and how we can help Colorado's wildlife." We work to educate as many community members as possible on how to live peacefully with their wild neighbors. In 2019, we carried this message to 150 events with over 8,000 participants.

We completed two extensive improvements to our facility in 2019: building a huge outdoor crow aviary and making major improvements to our outside fox enclosure. We can now care for orphans of both species until they are ready for release instead of transferring them to other rehabilitators.

Financially, we remain strong too. Colorado Gives Day is an important fundraiser for us every year (\$46,000 raised), as is our annual gala, *Wild Night for Wildlife* (\$148,515 raised). In 2020, the board will develop a new strategic plan that will take us into the future. This past fall, we retained a consulting firm to conduct a philanthropic feasibility study to test the possibilities for a new Greenwood facility in the Denver metro area. We are looking forward to receiving those results in February.

Staff and Volunteers! It is always most gratifying to see how incredible this group of caring people is. We continue to maintain a year-round staff of nine at the center along with 29 seasonal staff and 18 licensed rehabilitators. Our stores have 10 staff dedicated to raising funds and awareness for Greenwood. These individuals, along with our volunteers and interns, are the reason we are so successful in executing our mission. In 2019, we had a total of 487 volunteers and interns who contributed over 35,000 hours!

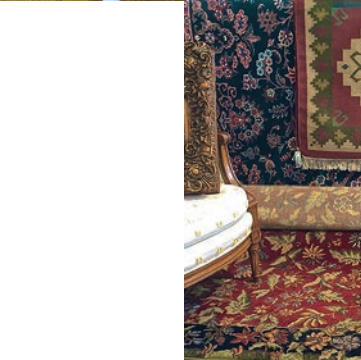
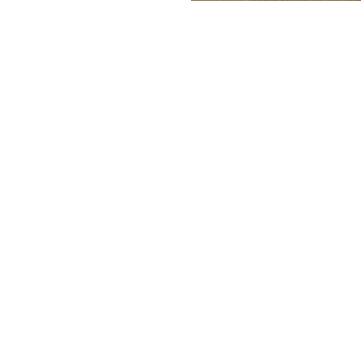
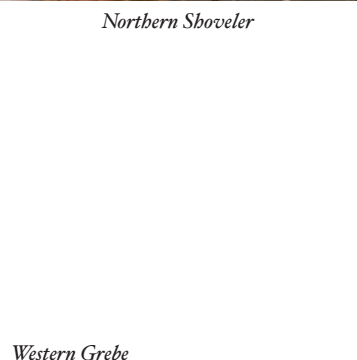
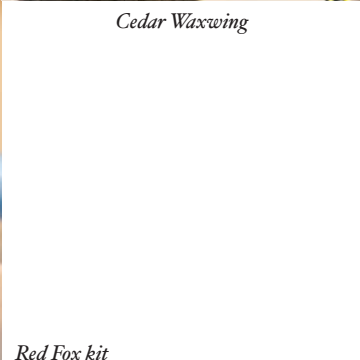
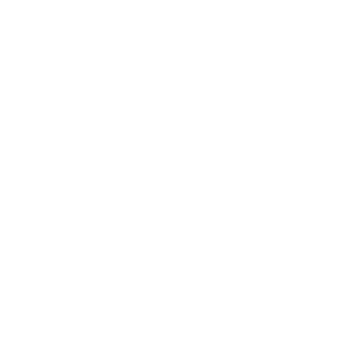

Volunteer, Internship, and Education/Outreach Summary

We couldn't do our great work to help the animals without the thousands of hours dedicated by hundreds of volunteers. Overall, 487 volunteers and interns devoted their time and efforts to Greenwood, totaling 35,472 hours — 7,133 hours more than the previous year — in animal care, education and outreach, Thrift Shop & Consignment Gallery assistance, fundraising, and more. The majority of their time was spent caring for baby mammals, songbirds, and waterfowl/shorebirds between the months of March and October, our busy baby season.

We continued to refine and enhance our internship program, recruiting 20 more interns than we did in 2018. In 2019, Greenwood provided hands-on instruction to 82 interns, who spent a total of 14,370 valuable hours getting experience caring for orphaned and injured wildlife. Our Wildlife Internship Program exposes interns from all backgrounds to an emerging discipline within the wildlife and environmental conservation fields. They learn about the reality and challenges that our local wildlife face due to continuous displacement by the expanding human footprint. They also learn to become good stewards for all the creatures that are an important part of our shared ecosystem.

Greenwood's Education and Outreach Program strives to achieve a similar goal — teaching people how to live with their local wildlife humanely and without conflicts. Our efforts reached a total of 8,086 adults and children in 2019 throughout Boulder County and beyond. In addition, our Animal Care Liaisons fielded thousands of calls per year, sometimes up to 100 each day, helping the public with human/wildlife issues.

Thrift Shop & Consignment Gallery

Once again, 2019 helped prove that our stores receive and sell the most amazing furniture, traditional and contemporary art, luxurious Persian rugs, jewelry, and other décor. We're proud of the fact that we processed, priced, and displayed 10,241 items in the Consignment Gallery alone last year. 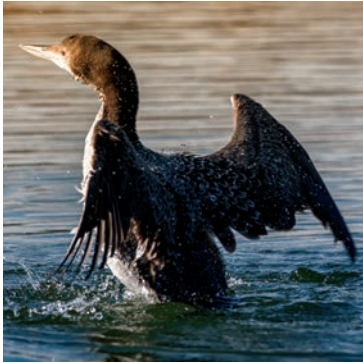

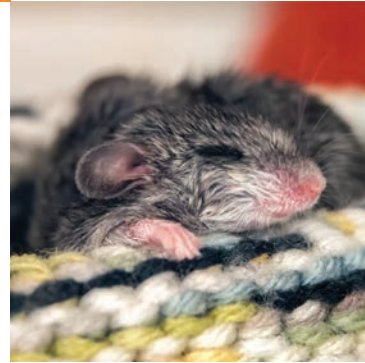
